Growing up in Zambia, Africa, I had an unorthodox childhood. I climbed trees, played soccer, collected matchbox cars and read anatomy books. I escaped near death several time: nearly bitten by a Gaboon Viper, stood on a crocodile, looked a lioness in the eye, charged by an elephant and held onto the neck of a galloping racehorse. All this before the age of 10. We arrived in Perth, Australia in 1976 and a year later moved to Alice Springs. I was passionate about film and was involved in creating a documentary on the Camel Race. This film won second prize for the Australian Children's Film Award and I personally presented a copy to Prince Charles for his 30th birthday.

At the age of 16 I travelled to Israel, to live on a kibbutz for 6 months. I worked in the cotton fields, kitchen and factory. I began to draw, and realized I could express the 'situations' that I was experiencing. During a trip to Jerusalem, I came across an exhibition by Yosl Bergner that transformed me. I knew what I wanted to do. Reach people through the power of Art, by speaking the language of the intangible.

I returned to complete Year 12 at Alice Springs High School. I was awarded the N.T Royal Institute of Architects Special Prize for Special Art Study. I intially studied Architecture at Adelaide University, but moved into Graphic Design degree majoring in Printmaking, and Photography After a particularly harrowing experience I left Adelaide and headed overseas. I stayed in Jerusalem where I worked as an au pair, waitress, shoemaker, cleaner in the Israel Museum and studied under a master silversmith/sculptor, Nissim Mizrachi. I backpacked through Europe and after 18 months returned to Adelaide to study Sculpture. I taught myself oil painting and as my passion and interest grew in conveying 'ideas' through visual metaphor, I developed my visual language. I participated in the Adelaide Fringe Festival and showed in several exhibitions. Two paintings were purchased by the South Australian Museum. a silkscreen print, and 'Catch 22" by the Australian Bicentennial Authority. I lived in various share-houses and painted in my bedrooms. At 26 I finally managed to return to Zambia and visit my grandparents. I was planning on continuing to travel to the U.K to further my art practice but I became extremely ill after eating infected crocodile meat and after 5 months, returned to Adelaide. I had met my partner in Zambia and had fallen pregnant. Owen joined me in Adelaide and with our son, we moved to Geelong. My daughter was born and I continued to paint while studying for a Bachelor Degree of Arts at Deakin University (History of Art and Architecture). We moved to Brisbane in 1993, and I attended Griffith University for a semester in Painting. I had two works purchased by the Queensland University, worked at Fireworks Gallery and completed a Diploma of Multimedia at QANTM, QUT. I was a founding member of Wanda, (Women's Art Collective) and the wildly successful Art in the Park, a monthly art market that was situated on the steps of the Queensland Art Gallery. I painted and held multiple exhibitions, painted murals (Norman Park Primary School, Macgregor Primary School) and ran a graphic design practice.

After 8 years in Brisbane, our family relocated to Melbourne. I showed in multiple group shows, held solo studio shows and furthered my education by taking a Graduate Diploma in Visual Communication (Swinburne) and a Diploma in International Urban and Environmental Management (RMIT). I was invited to be an Artist in Residence at Geelong Grammar School and my work "You Are Here' was one of two works included in the CUSP exhibition and was purchased for their collection. My marriage dissolved and after 19 years in Melbourne, I relocated to Noosa, Queensland. In 2020, QLD University Arts Museum, included my painting, "Watching My Life Go By" (2000) in a major retrospective exhibition, UnLearning. I finally had my dream come true with the completion of a painting studio designed by my father Walter Dobkins. I participated in the Noosa Open Studios (2019, 2020). My solo exhibition in 2020 of 21 paintings that spoke to the devastating bushfires, "Where There's Smoke", was held at Butter Factory Art Centre in Cooroy.






The Henry Tayali Art Gallery is home to authentic Zambian art.
